




Fiddler on the Roof




PEP ASSEMBLIES


It was a great year for Pep Assemblies at P.S.H.S. and it's due to the participation and cooperation of all.













POT POURRI





Indians Begin Season Against 4A Champs

They won their first league game against the eventual DVL champs, Palo Verde, with a score of 12-7. At El Centro they lost a heart-breaker 8-15.


The Indians smashed the 3A Montgomery at Homecoming 30-6. Palm Springs went on to finish with a 5-4 record.





JV Football-1971




Wrestling 71-72



The squad started off its season with a 4th place at the Arab Clasic, they moved on to Roubidoux where Dennis Blackner took first in his weight class.


There are 13 different weight classes ranging from 98 to 235 maximum.



Varsity Basketball
















